About FAI

The Fédération Aéronautique Internationale (FAI) is the world governing body for air sports and aeronautical and astronautical world records. Founded in 1905, FAI brings together national air sport organisations and international air sport communities worldwide and is committed to promoting safe, fair and inclusive participation in air sports.

About the Role

FAI is seeking experienced and highly motivated individuals to serve as volunteer members of the FAI Disciplinary Committee.

The FAI Disciplinary Committee plays an important role in ensuring the independent, fair and consistent application of the FAI Statutes, rules and regulations. Its members are responsible for considering disciplinary matters referred to the Committee and issuing independent and reasoned decisions in accordance with the FAI Disciplinary Code.

This role requires independence, impartiality, sound judgement, discretion and a strong commitment to fairness and integrity in international sport.

Key Responsibilities

FAI Disciplinary Committee Members shall have the following responsibilities:

- Review case files, written submissions and evidence;
- Participate in disciplinary hearings, primarily by videoconference;
- Assess facts and evidence independently and impartially;
- Interpret and apply the FAI Disciplinary Code and other applicable FAI Statutes, rules and regulations;
- Determine whether a disciplinary violation has been established and, where applicable, the appropriate disciplinary measure;
- Contribute to the preparation of clear and reasoned decisions;
- Respect the rights of the parties throughout the proceedings;
- Maintain strict confidentiality; and
- Disclose any circumstances that could give rise to a conflict of interest or doubts regarding their independence or impartiality.

Profile and Experience

Applicants should demonstrate:

- Fluency in written and spoken English;
- Relevant professional qualifications and/or substantial experience in law, dispute resolution, sports governance, ethics, disciplinary proceedings or judicial/quasi-judicial decision-making;
- Experience serving on disciplinary, judicial, ethics, appeals or other adjudicative bodies would be a strong advantage;
- Strong analytical skills and the ability to assess complex factual and regulatory matters objectively;
- The ability to handle sensitive and confidential information with discretion and professionalism;
- Knowledge of air sports matters and/or experience within other International Sports Federations would be desirable
- The ability to work effectively in an international and multicultural environment; and
- A strong commitment to fairness, independence, integrity and the values of sport.

FAI welcomes applications from qualified candidates from different professional, geographic and cultural backgrounds.

Appointment and Term

The FAI Disciplinary Committee consists of a Chair, a Deputy Chair and between three and six other members.

Members are appointed by the FAI Executive Board, subject to ratification by the FAI General Conference.

Appointments are for a renewable four-year term.

Practical Information

These positions are voluntary. However, where attendance at meetings or travel is required, FAI will reimburse reasonable expenses incurred.

How to Apply

Candidates interested in contributing their expertise to the independent and fair resolution of disciplinary matters within international air sports are invited to apply.

Applications should include:

- an up-to-date CV; and
- a brief letter of motivation outlining the candidate's relevant qualifications, experience and motivation for serving on the FAI Disciplinary Committee.
